

Please Remember to Steer Clear.



If you come upon an incident along the side of the road that involves an emergency responder, please remember to Steer Clear.

Please remember under Pennsylvania's Steer Clear Law, motorists are required to move at least one lane away from the incidents.

Emergency responders can include: law enforcement, tow truck operators, Department of Transportation vehicles involved in emergency assistance, and other emergency personnel.

If you cannot move over because of traffic or other conditions, you must reduce your speed.

Failure to move over or slow down will not only result in a citation that carries a fine of up to \$250, but drivers cited for traffic violations in these situations will face double fines. If that violation leads to a worker being injured, a 90-day license suspension could result.

If you are involved in a crash:

For a crash that does not involve injury or major damage to the vehicle:

- Move vehicles from the roadway.
 - Exchange insurance, driver and vehicle information along with phone numbers for the driver and insurance company.
 - Note any minor damage and statement of what occurred.
 - You can contact police to respond.

For other crashes:

- Contact 911 for police, and if needed, fire and ambulance response.
 - Police will require your driver's license, insurance and vehicle registration information.
 - Police will use the information along with statements of what occurred for a crash report.
 - The driver may request a particular towing company or the police will contact one for removal of vehicle.

If your vehicle becomes disabled:

- Contact 911 for police assistance.
- Know your location (route, mile marker, cross street).
- Turn on four-way flashers or tie a flag to indicate assistance is needed.
- Have available preferred tow company information.
- If none, the police will contact a tow truck.
- Keep emergency contact information inside vehicle for police/EMS to contact family if needed.
